



2018 ASL National Final

9th & 10th March 2018

Riverslide Skate Park, Melbourne, Victoria

Information for Competitors:

Congratulations again for making the National Final of the Australian Skateboarding League. This document provides competitors with the relevant information you need to be familiar with leading up to the competition.

Please be on time on the day. We have a very tight schedule and a lot of riders to get through in a short space of time. To make sure we are able to do this and allow everyone the chance to compete, we need everyone to be aware of the time and what is happening in the park at all times.

General Flow:

Each competitor will have 2X 45 second runs. Only one skater will be on the park at a time. Each rider will be allocated into a heat within their division which will become known upon Checking In for the competition. It is vital that all riders attend the Rider Briefing at the allocated time. Any riders not present at the Rider Briefing will be dropped from the competition.

Following the Rider Briefing, Heat 1 will have a 5 minute warm up on the park, which will lead straight into the competition for Heat 1. Each rider will have their first run. Once every rider in Heat 1 has competed once, they will all ride for their second minute. At the conclusion of Heat 1, Heat 2 will have 5 minutes to warm up, and the flow will be the same as Heat 1. This will continue for each division.

All scores for the heats will be made available live during the National Final on www.theboardr.com.

There will be a Final for the top 5 competitors from each division. The Final's will occur at the conclusion of the Open Male category, and follow the same division flow of the competition. In the Final, each rider will have one 90 second run on the park individually. This run will be the rider's final score, and placing within the event.

Presentation for all categories will occur at the end of the event. Prizes will be awarded to the top three place getters in each division.

Prior to Presentations, there will be a Best Trick competition. This competition is open to all riders, however priority may be given to ASL registered competitors. Competitors of the Best Trick Competition must be 13 years of age or older. The Best Trick Competition will occur down the Big Rail and the Hubba. To compete in the Best Trick Competition, riders need to have registered for the Best Trick Competition separately from ASL at the Registration tent throughout the day.

Please have a read through the event timeline to familiarise yourself with the structure and timing of the event.



Quick Read Info:

- All riders will have 2X 45 second runs where they are the only rider on the park during that time.
- The rider will be scored from 0 to 100, 100 being the highest
- Of the 2 runs, only the highest scoring run will count towards the competitors score
- While a competitor's heat is in progress they must wait in the competitor tent at the entrance to the park. There will be chairs and drinks provided for all competitors waiting to compete.
- Entrants under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol will be refused entry
- All competitors will compete in the division that they have qualified for. There will be no changing of divisions on the day of the competition
- All scores will be made live on the day of the competition for the Heats. The scores for the Final will not be made live. You can follow along on www.theboardr.com on the day of the competition.
- The Final will be the top 5 riders from each division. Each Final's competitor will have 90 seconds on the park to complete their last run. The score from this 90 second run will be the final score for the competitor.

Competitor Code of Conduct:

- Competitors shall not use abusive or disrespectful language
- Competitors shall not taunt or humiliate any other participants
- Competitors shall not abuse, mistreat or mishandle any event equipment or property

Competitor Check In:

Only competitors that have pre-registered will be able to compete at the ASL National Final, this means that all competitors need to do on the day of competition is Check-In at the Tent. Check In will be open from 1pm onwards.

- Competitors must "Check In" at the Registration tent prior to the competition
- At Check In, riders will need to confirm their details including DOB, location, sponsors, and take a new Head Shot for The Boardr in front of Sponsor logos
- All Riders will be given a wristband which they will need to wear to access the tent and the park. The wristband will be labelled with the riders Competition Division as well as Heat Number
- At Check In, all riders will be informed of their division Rider Briefing time. All riders must attend their stated rider briefing, otherwise they will be dropped from the competition. This is the final check of attendance prior to competing.

Competitor Briefing:

- All competitors must stay at the Rider Briefing until the briefing is complete
- The Rider Briefing is where the event organisers will convey important information for all riders to know before they compete.
- If any competitor is not present for their allocated rider briefing, they will be dropped from the competition.



- All riders will have 2X 45 second runs on the park. There will only be one rider on the park at a time.
- All competitors will have 30 seconds to move to their starting point in the park before the time commences. As soon as the previous rider's time is over, the 30 seconds will start for the rider to find their place. The time will start on the call of the MC.
- Once the 60 seconds is up, no more tricks can be performed and the rider must make their way back to the tent to allow the next rider time to find their starting spot.
- Any tricks performed after the time cap will not be judged or included towards the riders score for that run.

How the Competition is judged:

There is to be no disputes over the scores. The Judges score is final. If there are any complaints on the day, they can be brought to the attention of staff at the Registrations Tent.

- All competitors will be judged on the tricks that they land and the quality of those tricks
- The greater the technical difficulty, the greater the score
- Contestants will be marked down if they continue to perform the same tricks
- Tricks done after time will not count towards your score
- All judges' scores are final and there are to be no disputes to the scores. Scores will be finalised after each rider has competed their run. Judges are only making decisions based on their professional opinion
- Scoring will be done through The Boardr, and for the Heats all scores will be live after they have been finalised. Competitors and spectators will be able to follow along with the scores online throughout the competition
- The best scoring run will be the final score

Safety Requirements:

The Use of Helmets:

- Participants must wear a helmet during the allocated "runs times" within this competition
- Helmets will be made available for any competitors without one

A helmet exemption may apply if the participant fits **all the** following criteria:

- The competitor is registered in the Opens "professional" Division
- Is over 18 years of age and has experience professional skateboarding
- Competition is for money and seen as a professional level event

Competitor Injury during a heat:

If a competitor is injured or has a substantial fall during a heat, he or she may opt to suspend the run, and continue with the remaining time after a rest or injury analysis is completed.
